Program Description: ACC's Health and Kinesiology program provides students with the knowledge to pursue a wide range of disciplines including health promotion, education, government, and not-for-profit health agencies. The department encourages students to live a healthy and active lifestyle.

The Associate of Science degree in Health provides students with the first two years of coursework towards a Bachelor of Science degree in Health, preparing them for transfer to a four-year college or university. It includes specific coursework appropriate to individual academic interest as well as current or future work activities. Transfer students should consult with an academic advisor to select corequisite courses that will be accepted at preferred transfer institution.

What Health Graduates Do

Employment opportunities exist in health promotion, education, government, and not-for-profit health agencies. Health educators/promoters maintain and improve individual and community health by assisting individuals and communities in adopting healthy behaviors. They plan, organize, and direct health education programs for group and community needs. They work with other health professionals, civic groups, and community officials to determine needs, develop goals, and evaluate the accessibility of health services. They also educate people on the availability of health resources and encourage them to make the most use of them.

Entry-Level Education

A 4-year Bachelor's degree in health studies, health promotions and/or community health is required. Master's and Doctoral degrees are also available within the field. Health Educators/Promoters may become a Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) through the National Commission for Health Education Credentialing, Inc. Regional Labor Market Information

Health Educators: New workers generally start around \$30,088. Normal pay for Health Educators is \$44,245 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$79,147. Over the last year, 22 companies have posted 131 jobs for Health Educators in this region. There are currently 215 Health Educators that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
