Therapeutic Recreation has joined other adjunct therapies as a nationally recognized profession in the Allied Health and Human Services fields. Students completing the AAS degree may apply to the Consortium for Therapeutic Recreational Activities Certification (CTRAC) as a Certified Therapeutic Recreation Associate (TRA/TXC).

Regional Labor Market Information

Recreational Therapists: New workers generally start around \$28,849. Normal pay for Recreational Therapists is \$53,696 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$62,514. Over the last year, 28 companies have posted 135 jobs for Recreational Therapists in this region. There are currently 93 Recreational Therapists that are employed in Austin-Round Rock, TX.
